

## Level 4 Referee FAQ

### 1. I have completed the course, what do I do now?

---

After completing the level 4 referee course please complete the following steps:

1. Register on [PlayFootball](#) as a first season referee
2. Set up your availability in [Schedula](#)
3. Attend your local training centre training session, see [Go!](#) for information.

### 2. I have completed all the steps above, when can I referee my first game?

---

- Make sure your Schedula is up to date with your availability.
- Football Victoria's appointments team will appoint you to matches via Schedula.
- Games will be released to you every Tuesday at 3pm (you will receive an email of your appointments).
- Log onto your Schedula account and click [confirm appointment\(s\)](#).

### 3. How many games can I referee a week?

---

The amount of games you receive will depend on your availability. If you are available to referees all day Saturday and Sunday you are more likely to receive more games. Typically, a referee can expect between 2-4 games on a weekend.

We are happy to work with you to appoint you to the amount of games that suits your schedule.

### 4. How do I get paid and how much?

---

Referees get paid on the day following the completion of the match. Referees will be paid in cash or cheque. [Click here to view the 2022 Referee Fees Schedule.](#)

### 5. Can I play and referee?

---

Yes. We encourage you to play and referee provided you keep your refereeing availability up to date. Our appointments team will then be able to find a suitable game for you based on your availability on Schedula and your experience.

## **6. Where do I collect my referee uniform from?**

---

Your referee uniform is collected at the practical component (part D) of the Level 4 Referee Course.

You will be presented with a green shirt, shorts, socks, whistle, two assistant flags and yellow and red cards.

## **7. What is a Referee Training Centre and which Training Centre do I belong to?**

---

Your Training Centre allocation is based on where you live. Your Referee Training Centre is your local refereeing family that provides weekly training sessions, welfare support and development opportunities.

Each Training Centre will have a team of experienced referees who have specific roles to support your refereeing. These include a Head Trainer, Welfare Support Officer and Level 4 Team Leader.
