

JGNPL U15 – U19 PLAYING FORMAT AND RULES



PLAYING FORMATS

The table below summarises the playing formats for Under 15 – Under 19 Junior Girls National Premier League:

THE NUMBER OF PLAYERS	11-a-side including a Maximum of 6 substitutes
NUMBER OF INTERCHANGE PERIODS	U15: Maximum of 2 interchange periods per Team in each half U17 – U19: Maximum of 3 interchange periods per Team in each half
THE FIELD OF PLAY	U15 – U17 Length: 90m (min) – 110 (max) Width: 50m (min) – 74m (max) U19 Length: 96m (min) – 110m (max) Width: 60m (min) – 74m (max)
GOAL SIZE	Conform with the IFAB Laws of the Game
BALL SIZE	Size 5
DURATION OF GAME	U15: 2 x 35 minute halves (= 70 minutes) U17: 2 x 40 minute halves (= 80 minutes) U19: 2 x 45 minute halves (= 90 minutes)
PENALTY AREA	Conform with the IFAB Laws of the Game



GOAL TYPE

It is required that solid goals or solid portable goals be used. If portable goals have wheels, they must have a gap of at least one size 5 ball between the wheel and the back of the goal line. The use of poles and markers as goals is prohibited. To comply with Australian Safety Standards, portable goals must be anchored securely to the ground. GOALKEEPER

The rule will be applied using the IFAB Laws of the Game.



THROW INS, CORNER KICK & GOAL KICK

MATCH RESULTS & POINTS TABLES

Results and ladders will remain in the 11v11 format. Match results and point tables will be published publicly by Football Victoria.



FOULS & MISCONDUCT

The rule will be applied using the IFAB Laws of the Game.



DISCIPLINE

Red or Yellow cards can be issued to players in JGNPL and U19 NPLW competitions.

For any offence that would ordinarily result in a red card for violent or offensive behaviour (i.e. R5 - Violent conduct, R3 - Spitting, R6 - Uses offensive or insulting or abusive language/ gestures) the match official will be required to submit a misconduct report to Football Victoria which may result in further disciplinary action for that player.



OTHER RULES

All other rules will be applied using the IFAB Laws of the Game. Rules of Competition will also be used by the competition administrator.
